Please nominate your student(s) no later than **31st May 2025**.

Students have to complete the on-line registration **from 1st April to 30th June 2025 (first term and full academic year)**. Please note that the **2nd term** application procedure will be available from **1st October to 30th November 2025** on the web. After completing the on-line procedure, we revise the application and we just only after the confirmation from the Faculty/School, we will send to the students the official acceptance letters.

2. Send the letter of admission within a maximum of 6 weeks after receiving the paper application (printed online application).

Erasmus+ students are not required to present a specific language certificate and do not need to pass a specific language level test.

Language courses:

Erasmus+ students with knowledge of B2 Spanish or less are encouraged to participate in the intensive courses before starting their studies in Cordoba. The courses are free of charge and offered for two weeks in September-October (for first semester or full year students) and January-February (for second semester students). The venue is UCOIdiomas (University of Córdoba's Language center). These courses will be part of the Learning Agreement subjects, having recognition of ECTS credits

H. Insurance

Erasmus+ students must present adequate medical coverage for their stay in Spain, in accordance with current regulations of their place of residence and / or the Spanish Consulate or Embassy where

they apply for their visa.

Students are personally responsible for obtaining insurance coverage for themselves and for their personal belongings. Insurance must be obtained prior to arrival in Spain and must cover costs in the event of illness or accident.

EU Students should provide the European Health Insurance Card; Extra EU Students should provide a private insurance.

Our institution will, if necessary, provide assistance in securing insurance for incoming and outgoing students and staff in accordance with the requirements of the Erasmus Charter for Higher Education.

In addition, it is compulsory to have travel and accident insurance before arrival at the University of Cordoba. Incoming students can obtain the same insurance coverage that the University of Cordoba offers its own students, which is private but has a special price (approximately EUR 19). More information at:
